# MOBILE PHONE POLICY



### Help for non-English speakers

### **PURPOSE**

To explain to our school community the Department's and Patterson Lakes Primary School's policy requirements and expectations relating to students using mobile phones and other personal mobile devices such as smartwatches, apple watches, etc. during school hours.

# SCOPE

This policy applies to:

- 1. All students and staff at Patterson Lakes Primary School and,
- 2. Students' personal mobile phones and other personal mobile devices brought onto school premises during school hours, including recess and lunchtime.

## **DEFINITION**

**A mobile phone** is a telephone with access to a cellular (telecommunication) system, with or without a physical connection to a network. For the purpose of this policy, 'mobile phone' refers to mobile phones and any devices that may connect to or have a similar functionality to a mobile phone such as smart watches, apple watches, etc.

### **POLICY**

Patterson Lakes Primary School understands that students may bring a personal mobile phone to school, particularly if they are travelling independently to and from school or they may have a medical condition.

At Patterson Lakes Primary School:

- Students who choose to bring mobile phones to school must have them switched off and securely stored during school hours.
- Exceptions to this policy may be applied if certain conditions are met (see below for further information)
- When emergencies occur, parents or carers should reach their child by calling the school's office.

#### Personal mobile phone use

In accordance with the Department's <u>Mobile Phones — Student Use Policy</u> issued by the Minister for Education, personal mobile phones must not be used at Patterson Lakes Primary School during school hours, including lunchtime and recess, unless an exception has been granted.

Where a student has been granted an exception, the student must use their mobile phone for the purpose for which the exception was granted, and in a safe, ethical and responsible manner.

### Secure storage

Mobile phones owned by students at Patterson Lakes Primary school are considered valuable items and are brought to school at the owner's (student's or parent/carer's) risk. Students are encouraged not to bring a mobile phone to school unless there is a compelling reason to do so. Please note that Patterson Lakes Primary School does not have accident insurance for accidental property damage or theft. Students and their parents/carers are encouraged to obtain appropriate insurance for valuable items. Where students bring a mobile phone to school, Patterson Lakes Primary School will provide secure storage. Secure storage is storage that cannot be readily accessed by those without permission to do so. At Patterson Lakes Primary School students are required to store their phones in a classroom safe or hand them into the school administration office to be placed in a lockable cupboard or safe.

#### **Enforcement**

Students who use their personal mobile phones inappropriately at Patterson Lakes Primary School may be issued with consequences consistent with our school's existing 'Student Wellbeing and Engagement', 'Digital Technologies' and 'Bullying Prevention' policies, and the 'Student Code of Conduct'.

At Patterson Lakes Primary School inappropriate use of mobile phones is **any use during school hours**, unless an exception has been granted, and particularly the use of a mobile phone:

- in any way that disrupts the learning of others.
- to send inappropriate, harassing or threatening messages or phone calls.
- to engage in inappropriate social media use including cyber bullying.
- to capture video or images of people, including students, staff and members of the school community without their permission.
- to capture video or images in the school toilets, changing rooms, swimming pools and gyms.
- during assessments.

#### Staff

- Teachers in charge of all excursions and trips involving students must ensure a mobile phone or similar appropriate communications device accompanies each trip, leaving current contact numbers with the Principal and Administration Office.
- Mobile phones are not to be used for private calls during school teaching and learning time.
- Using a mobile phone for school business whilst on excursions or camps is appropriate.
- In most cases, it is not appropriate for staff to have mobile phones on during scheduled meetings.
- The school does not accept responsibility for lost or damaged personal property, including mobile phones.
- Any photos or videos taken of students should be deleted from personal devices as soon as practicable.

### **Exceptions**

Exceptions to the policy:

- · may be applied during school hours if certain conditions are met, specifically,
  - Health and wellbeing-related exceptions; and
  - Exceptions related to managing risk when students are offsite.
- can be granted by the Principal, or by the teacher for that class, in accordance with the Department's Mobile Phones Student Use Policy.

The three categories of exceptions allowed under the Department's Mobile Phones — Student Use Policy are:

### 1. Learning-related exceptions

### 2. Health and wellbeing-related exceptions

# 3. Exceptions related to managing risk when students are offsite

| Specific exception                                                                          | Documentation                          |
|---------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------|----------------------------------------|
| Travelling to and from excursions                                                           | Risk assessment planning documentation |
| Students on excursions and camps                                                            | Risk assessment planning documentation |
| When students are offsite (not on school grounds) and unsupervised with parental permission | Risk assessment planning documentation |
| Students with a dual enrolment or who need to undertake intercampus travel                  | Risk assessment planning documentation |

Where an exception is granted, the student can only use the mobile phone for the purpose for which it was granted.

### Camps, excursions and extracurricular activities

Patterson Lakes Primary School will provide students and their parents and carers with information about items that can or cannot be brought to camps, excursions, special activities and events, including personal mobile phones.

### **Exclusions**

This policy does not apply to

- Out-of-School-Hours Care (OSHC)
- Out-of-school-hours events
- · Travelling to and from school
