We're excited to share that the students are busy preparing for the Term 4 concert!

It will take place on **Tuesday 14th October**, in two timeslots: **10am-11:30 and 2:45-4:15**. Please mark this date in your calendars – it's going to be a fun and lively event! Your child has probably been talking to you about it and is excited to perform.

Each class already knows their song and is preparing for the performance, so if you would like to add any extra details to their costume to match the theme, feel free to do so! However, please remember to keep the outfit practical for the whole school day (think free dress day). Students will be wearing their costumes all day, so please ensure that their outfit is comfortable and appropriate for school. For example, **closed-toed shoes** and **sun-smart clothing** are a must.

To make things easier on the day of the concert, students will come to school dressed in their class outfits. This will help save time and keep things moving smoothly. Below are the colours each class should wear:

- OA + OB: Black (pants, shorts, or skirt) and Pink top (Barbie and Ken theme)
- OC + OD: Blue (pants, shorts, or skirt) and Blue top (dressed as baby sharks)
- 1A + 1B: Black (pants, shorts, or skirt) and Green top (jungle theme)
- 1C + 2A: Black (pants, shorts, or skirt) and Gold top
- **2B + 2C:** Blue (pants, shorts, or skirt) and Yellow top (Minions theme)
- **3B + 3C:** Lobster theme: Black or Red (pants, shorts or skirt), red top. Rock star theme: Dress in a rock star themed outfit (think sunglasses, sparkly top etc).
- 3A + 4A: Fluoro colours (80's theme)
- **4B + 4C:** Black (pants, shorts, or skirt) and a top in Red, Purple, or Pink (any shade) with a touch of sparkle (Dressed like a formal choir with touches of glitter on top)
- **5A + 5B:** Black (pants, shorts, or skirt) and Red top
- **5C +5D:** Black (pants, shorts, or skirt) and Orange top (tiger theme)
- **6A + 6B + 6C:** Fun Bright Colours (think Colour run outfits-such as white t-shirt decorated with bright colours)

We would prefer plain t-shirts, but if there are any pictures or writing on them, we'll simply turn them inside out or wear them back to front so the focus stays on the colours. Also, if you have any **hats**, **sunglasses**, or **sparkly accessories**, feel free to send them along to add some extra fun to their costume!


