1: 1 DEVICES PROGRAM AT PATTERSON LAKES PRIMARY SCHOOL

As many families would appreciate, Patterson Lakes Primary School has successfully operated a voluntary 1:1 Devices program for more than a decade. This program was very helpful during the COVID 19 period, with the school also supplying families who did not have access to a device at home, with a school owned device for them to retain. The Victoria Government has brought in a new policy beginning in 2027 from Foundation to Year 6.

Under the new guidelines, schools:

- 1. will no longer invite families to purchase or bring their own digital devices to use at school for Prep to Grade 6
- 2. will follow new recommended digital device times, including minimal device time for Foundation to Year 2; and a maximum of 90 minutes per day for Years 3 to 6.

These changes are intended to support families by reducing cost-of-living pressures. They will also support students by reducing screen-time which can reduce the risk of eye strain, sedentary behaviour, and reduced peer interaction. These reforms complement Victoria's nation-leading mobile phone restrictions, ensuring an integrated approach to addressing digital distraction and the inappropriate use of technology.

This means we will be ceasing our current 1:1 program from 2027 on and we will continue to provide digital devices for use by students who did not join any of the previous program opportunities. Students who have been using 1:1 devices prior to 2027 will be able to continue to bring their devices to school, but we will be following the new recommended device use times. As you know, we already provide school-owned digital devices for student learning and this program will continue beyond 2027.

Students with disability who use a digital device as a reasonable adjustment are exempt from these changes.






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
